







Temporary Housing: Navigation Centers






Exits by Population




FY 2019 Problem Solving Goal (825)

Housing Ladder





State Policy Update

SB 918 (Homeless Youth Act)

• Grant program removed and amendments simply add youth aspect to statewide plan to end homelessness. Waiting floor vote. Likely to pass.

• AB 2161 (Homeless Integrated Data Warehouse)

• Will not be moving forward

• AB 2162 (Supportive Housing Streamlining Bill)

• Awaiting floor vote

SB 1045 (Conservatorship)

• Awaiting floor vote

AB 186 (Safe Injection Sites)

• Passed legislature. Waiting Governor's action
