#### **HSH & Homelessness in San Francsico**

- →PIT Count: 8,035 people experiencing homelessness in 2019
  - 2019 Unsheltered PIT Count: 5,180 people
  - 2021 Sheltered PIT Count: 4,000 sheltered guests (no unsheltered count)
- The Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH) strives to make homelessness in San Francisco rare, brief, and one-time through the provision of coordinated, compassionate, and high-quality services.



#### Partnership to Address Vehicular Homelessness

- ► Collaboration: Bayview-based service providers, community members, State Parks staff, and multiple City departments worked for 1 year+ to develop the Vehicle Triage Center proposal.
- **►Bayview Advocates** and **SF Homeless Outreach Team** have been working with people encamped in the area.
- ► Multiple City departments respond to encampment conditions, but without a safe alternative place for people to go, these responses cannot be successful.



#### Homelessness in San Francsico

- 50% of people experiencing homeless are over the age of 50.
- 44% became homeless after the age of 50.
- Nationally, 70-80% become homeless in their home region.
- Homelessness is correlated to affordability and income inequality.
- Housing prices nationally have quadrupled since 1980 and rents have doubled.
- Homelessness is a racial equity issue.
- Treatment (all kinds) is best received when people are housed.



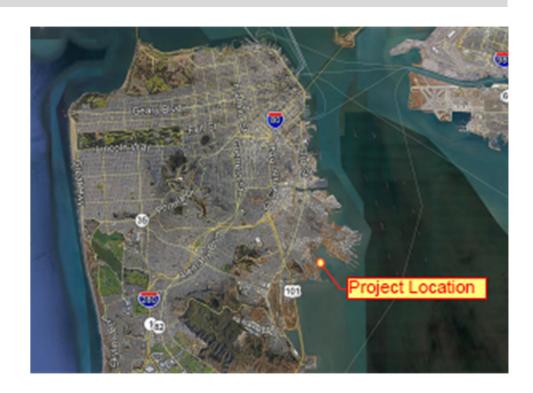
### **Overview of Vehicular Homelessness**

- ► August 2021 count found **1,088 vehicles** with unhoused people in San Francisco.
  - Concentrated in West Side (Taraval) and Bayview (Candlestick) areas.
- ►677 occupied vehicles in District 10
  - 121 occupied vehicles in the Bayview
  - 154 at Candlestick Point SRA area
  - 73 in Hunters Point



#### Candlestick VTC: Location

- ► Proposed partnership with State Parks for a Vehicle Triage Center in the Boat Launch Parking Lot
- Capacity for ~155 vehicles and 177 people

- Office and confidential meeting space

#### **Amenities & Services**

- ► The Candlestick Safe Parking Site would include space for up to 155 vehicles with 177 guests.
- Site fits 86 RVs and 69 passenger vehicles, including 37 secondary vehicles with no occupants (people accessing services elsewhere).
- There would be 9 accessible parking spaces and a family zone.
- Services include case management and 24/7 staffing and security.



# **Program Model**

- →Program is a low barrier model to address variety of clinical needs:
  - Single adults, couples and families
  - Voluntary services
  - Strength-based; client input improves program design
- ► Focus on removing barriers and getting clients connected to care to stabilize and support clients exiting the homelessness response system.



#### **Outreach & Placement**

- **∽SFHOT** and **HSOC**, in collaboration with Bayview-based providers:
  - Assess the area.
  - Outreach to people living in their vehicles.
  - Create a by name and vehicle list.
  - Invite these people into the program.

#### **∽**Priority:

• People with extended time encamped in the area will be prioritized for placement.



# **Phase One: Pre-Opening**

**→Bayview Coordinated Outreach** to include Homeward Bound, SFHOT/D10 outreach workers, Access Point outreach staff.

- **►**Locations for outreach:
  - Hunters Point Expressway
  - Jamestown Avenue up Gilman Ave.
  - Carroll Ave down Ingles



# Phase Two: Pre-Opening (October)

- Site-specific outreach with the staff trailers and porta potties placed
  - same area as Phase One

←There are 150+ RVs and vehicles that people are living in around the Candlestick Point SRA



# **Phase 3: Program Opening**

- ► Site opens and transfer of clients and program moved to Candlestick SRA lot.
- ◆Target opening date: December 2021





# Candlestick VTC: Next Steps



- Conducting community engagement process
- →Approval from the BOS
- **→**Approval from the **State Lands Commission**
- **-**Coordination with other **Departments**



## Multidepartmental Support for Project

#### ► San Francisco Police Department: Public Safety

- Set up a schedule of daily passing calls to the Park and program
- SFPD will advise the design and operations teams on Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED)
- SFPD Bayview station officers will meet regularly with park staff and VTC staff to address safety issues in the Park and surrounding the VTC program.
- SFPD will create an emergency access plan with the vehicle triage center
- Support SFMTA in enforcing parking regulations in the area
- SFPD will provide crime data for the neighborhood to inform the public about safety and crime stats in the neighborhood upon request from the community.



## Multidepartmental Support for Project

- **→Dumping Prevention & Debris Removal San Francisco Public Works will:** 
  - Remove litter and debris at least 3 days per week
  - Post **no dumping** signs
  - Explore the possibility of deploying Illegal Dumping Surveillance Cameras
- →Parking Enforcement San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency will:
  - Repost the removed or damaged parking regulations signs
  - Focus on **enforcing parking regulations** in the area to prevent re-encampment when the site opens and people encamped in the area are invited into the program.
