Subject: HSH Sole Source Contracts for Fiscal Year 2020-2021

Purpose: To update the Board of Supervisors on the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing's (HSH) sole source contracts for Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-2021 in compliance with the Sunshine Ordinance Section 67.24(e).

FY20-21 Sole Source Reporting: During FY 2020-2021, HSH did not enter into any new sole source contracts.

Active Sole Source Contracts: Below is a list of the four remaining active sole source contracts and their expiration dates that transferred from the Department of Public Health (DPH) to HSH in 2016.
