## **Coordinated Entry & Housing Demographics**







#### **Tenderloin Emergency Initiative: Operational Phases**

#### Phase I: Engagement & Assessment November 2021

- Coordinate with City and non-City stakeholders
- 2. Access top problems in the Tenderloin neighborhood
- 3. Propose short and long-term solutions

#### Phase II: Crisis Operations December 2021 -March 2022

- 1. Connect to services
- 2. Intervene in street activity
- 3. Invest in infrastructure

# Tenderloin Emergency Initiative: Progress & Outcomes

#### **∽**Linkage Center:

- Served 3,197 guests since opening
- 706 people referred to medical, mental health or substance use treatment

- Throughout the Tenderloin:
  - 145 shelter placements from the streets and the Linkage Center
  - 72 people in the housing process
  - Referred 413 people from the streets to medical, mental health, or substance use disorder treatment
  - SFPD made 66 arrests for drug dealing and seized 5,926 grams of fentanyl
  - Assessed, repaired, and hardened 72 different streetlights

## **Program Highlights: Outreach**

15

#### **→** Street Wellness Response Team

- Launched first team in January
- Collaboration between HSH and SFFD
- Dispatched by 911 and can respond to situations on the street involving people experiencing homelessness and in need a wellness check.

- **←** Tenderloin Emergency Initiative and Linkage Center
  - SFHOT staff co-located at the Linkage Center.
  - Providing Coordinated Entry Assessments.
  - Linking guests with shelter and housing.



## **Program Highlights: Shelter**

Bayview Vehicle Triage Center

- Opened in January.
- 100 people with 57 vehicles enrolled.
- At capacity for Phase I.
- Emergency lot on Carroll has closed, nearly all guests moved to the VTC.

- **→** Gene Friend Recreation Center
  - Temporary COVID-positive shelter
  - Can serve up to 70 adults
- Bryant Street Navigation Center
  - Opened in January to serve as a COVID response shelter
  - Operated by ECS



## **Program Highlights: Shelter**





#### **→** Ansonia Hotel at 711 Post

- Proposal to open as a semi-congregate shelter for adults.
- Plans to move some guests
  from Fulton and Jones Safe Sleep sites to
  this program, if they have not yet connected
  to housing prior to the sites closing.
- 250-person COVID-informed capacity.
- Operated and leased by Urban Alchemy.
- Pending BOS approval (scheduled for vote at Full Board on 2/8).

#### ➤ New Acquisition Proposal: 835 Turk Street

- 114 units
- Lobby
- Parking garage
- Generous-sized rooms
- Private bathrooms
- Elevator
- Community kitchen and lounge
- ► Acquisition approved by Board on 2/1

The Tahanan is opened and fully leased up.

►145 new PSH units.

→ Partnership with Mercy and ECS.





### **Program Highlights: Housing**

#### **►** Eula Hotel Acquisition Finalized

- 25 units for TAY
- Provider selection process underway
- Closed on purchase 12/30
- HomeKey application submitted

#### Homekey Award

• \$54.7M for the acquisition and operations of the Panoramic.

#### **→** Flexible Housing Subsidy Pool

- Bayview Flex Subsidy Pool SOI closed and under review.
- SOI for 835 Turk has closed and is under review.
- SOI for Flex Subsidy Pool for TAY and Families to be issued in February.
- SOI for family Housing Ladder program to be issued in February.




