Coordinated Entry & Housing Demographics








Race is incomplete for 9% of clients (3% Data Not Collected; 6% Doesn't Know / Refused)



Ethnicity is incomplete for 1% of clients (1% Data Not Collected; 1% Doesn't Know / Refused)





Sexual Orientation is incomplete for 6% of clients (4% Data Not Collected; 2% Refused)





Total Vacancies 852


Units Ready for Referral


Referral Status



Permanent Supportive Housing Vacancies

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- **←** Challenges with Decreasing Vacancies in PSH:
 - Units staying offline for too long for repairs
 - Placements delayed by documentation barriers
 - 1:1 referral process
 - Lack of capacity within Housing Navigation services



Permanent Supportive Housing Vacancies

Steps taken to address vacancy challenges

- In March 2022, HSH will implement low-barrier documentation policy across all adult PSH programs
 - Policy piloted with SIP housing process in Fall 2021
 - Will expand to TAY and Family programs shortly
- Piloted batch referral process with SIP housing process

- Added three new Access Points with Housing Navigation Services
- Developed a Vacancy Tracker
- Deployed HSH Housing Subsidy Team to Tenderloin Linkage Center
- Created and distributed a policy outlining length of time units can be offline



Tenderloin Emergency Initiative: Progress & Outcomes

Data as of February 20, 2022

∽ Linkage Center:

- 10,321 visits to Linkage Center
- 1,478 connections to services
- **75-80** showers provided daily

→ Throughout the Tenderloin:

- Over 340 shelter placements from the streets and the Linkage Center
- 123 people in the housing process
- Connected **1,613** people to services
- 9,842 grams of Fentanyl seized
- 1,548 tons of waste cleaned up

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- Street Ambassador Services
 - HSH released a Solicitation of Interest in February for Street Ambassador Services
 - Will support new and existing programs in highly impacted areas
 - Expand provider capacity for these critical services

Program Highlights: Shelter

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→ Bryant Navigation Center

- Will reopen on March 9, 2022
- Will serve up to 61 guests at COVID-capacity
- Serve the TGNCI community and cis-gender women
- St. James Infirmary is the selected provider for this program

► Dolores Street and Jazzie's Place

- Will reopen in late March 2022
- Serve up to 53 guests at COVIDcapacity
- Jazzie's Place will accept referrals from Community Partners serving LGBTQ+ guests

Program Highlights: Shelter

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∽ Adante Hotel

- Will open in March 2022
- Former SIP hotel
- Hybrid non-congregate COVID overflow and winter shelter
- Will serve up to 93 guests

→ 33 Gough Cabin Pilot Program

- Replace 44 tent spots
 with 70 non-congregate cabins
- First guests will begin moving into cabins in early March 2022
- ► FY21-22 Interfaith Winter Shelter
 - Will close March 26, 2022



Program Highlights: Shelter





→ Baldwin Hotel at 74 6th Street

- Proposal to convert the Baldwin Hotel as a non-congregate SAFE Navigation Center for adults in Summer 2022
- Will serve up to 160 adults
- HSH has begun community engagement process with first meeting on March 8, 2022

- Board of Supervisors approval will be required

Documentation Policy Rollout: •

- HSH implementing low-barrier documentation policy across all adult PSH programs in March
- Policy piloted with SIP housing process in fall 2021
- Will extend to TAY and family programs soon

- Key tool for Continuum of Care subrecipients
- Includes policies and procedures related to Continum of Care program
- Available on the HSH website

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Program Highlights: Coordinated Entry

► Updates to Coordinated Entry Standards for Survivors of Violence

- HSH will bring recommended updates to the Coordinated Entry Written Standards as pertains to Survivors of Violence to LHCB CE Sub-Committee on March 8, 2022
- Recommendations for changes in standards include:
 - Making consistent the definition of survivors to include other forms of violence
 - Sections on survivor data management
- Public Comment will be available starting on March 8, 2022
- HSH will present final proposed changes for to the LHCB for adoption

- HSH is partnering with National Alliance for Safe Housing (NASH) to host Survivor Listening Sessions



Interim Progress Report:

- 455 referrals submitted
 - Over 50% of total
- 284 vouchers issued
- 67 households housed
