





Coordinated Entry & Housing Demographics














Units Ready for Referral 502








New Dashboard: Housing Vacancies over Time

Tenderloin Emergency Initiative: Progress & Outcomes

1666 SFHOT encounters in the Tenderloin.

• Approx. 108 encounters per week

565 shelter placements from the Tenderloin.

• 321 placements from the Linkage Center.

162 housing referrals from the Tenderloin.

• 84 move ins.

Program Highlights

Program Highlights: Problem Solving

- **→ Housing Location Assistance** to launch in April or May:
 - Help navigating the rental market.
- **~** City's **Emergency Rental Assistance**:
 - State COVID-19 Rental Assistance ended on March 31, 2022.
 - SF program serves households who need assistance with:
 - Back/future rent for April 2022 and onwards.
 - Rent from April 2020 to March 2022 (didn't apply to the state program, were rejected, or not enough \$).
 - Security deposit or first/last month's rent.
 - Rent before April 2020.
- ► Input sessions:
 - Problem Solving employment screener pilot: feedback on program to connect households with workforce development.
 - Housing Stabilization Services: input from frontline staff and people with lived experience.




Program Highlights: Shelter - KEEP

- **→ Taimon Booton Navigation Center** opened March 9, 2022.
 - Formerly known as Bryant Street Navigation Center.
 - Serves transgender, gender non-conforming, and intersex community as well as cisgender women.
 - Has sheltered over 20 guests since opening.





Program Highlights: Shelter



Cabin Pilot Program opened at 33 Gough:

- 70 individual cabin units.
- First move-ins on February 28, 2022.

Program Highlights: Shelter

Program Updates

- → Dolores Shelter (including Jazzie's Place) to re-open in April 2022
- ◆Third non-congregate winter shelter opened on March 7, 2022:
 - Hybrid site with one floor for COVID overflow.
 - Runs through June 2022.
- Problem Solving services launched in family shelter system in March.

Program Wind Downs

- **∽**Safe Sleep:
 - Jones demobilized on March 11, 2022.
 - Fulton to demobilize in spring/summer.
 - Two sites will remain.
- ►Interfaith Winter Shelter closed on March 26, 2022.



Program Highlights: Coordinated Entry


►LYRIC Access Point for TAY reopening in April.

- **∽**Safe Housing Working Group launched.
 - Community Needs Assessment for Survivors is a planning process to improve survivor access, safety, choice, and privacy in the Homelessness Response System.

→ Variety of Coordinated Entry policies online for public comment.

Program Highlights: Housing

∽Provider selection:

- Bayview Flex Housing Subsidy Pool provider selected.
- Upcoming SOI for Family and Youth Flex Housing Subsidy Pool.

←Landlord incentives:

 Introducing damage mitigation fund as additional tool for scattered site housing providers to negotiate with private landlords.

→Updated Local Operating Subsidy Program (LOSP) manual.



HSH Update: 2021 CoC Award

- ← Continuum of Care: HSH awarded \$51,403,408
 - \$3,745,728 reduction due to FMR decreases.
- →All 59 renewal projects approved \$47,843,632 in CoC funding, including:
 - 5 Rapid Rehousing projects
 - 46 Permanent Supportive Housing projects
 - 3 HMIS projects
 - 3 Coordinated Entry projects
- **∽**New projects:
 - DV Bonus project \$2,309,776
 - CoC Planning Grant \$1,250,000
