














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
### **Housing – Placements**


### **Current Housing Vacancies**



Data snapshot as of June 16, 2022.




### **Housing Vacancies over Time**



Monthly data snapshots through June 16, 2022.




### **Housing Vacancies over Time**



### **SIP Guest Exits: Demographics**


42% of guests eligible for the SIP housing process were older adults (60+).49% of guests from this group who have been housed are older adults.






### **SIP Guest Exits: Demographics**



### **Tenderloin Emergency Initiative: Progress & Outcomes**

2,638 SFHOT encounters in the Tenderloin.

• Approx. 90 encounters per week

1,043 shelter placements from the Tenderloin.

• 692 placements from the Tenderloin Center.

273 Tenderloin Center guests referred to housing.

• 175 move ins.

# **Program Highlights: Equity Update**

← DEI Training Officer position posted; candidate interviews in mid-July.

### ←HSH All Staff DEI Training:

- Training materials in the review process.
- Scheduled for summer 2022.
- •Racial Equity Action Plan:
  - Meetings in July with HR, DEI Committee, and Executive Team to identify progress and set priorities.



### **Program Highlights: Outreach**

### • Street Wellness Response Team expansion:

- Beginning on June 25, the Street Wellness Response Team expanded from one team to five teams.
- The program will start 24/7 operations.
- SWRT has access to **24/7 shelter beds** when available.

•SFHOT continues to support outreach and shelter placements in the Tenderloin.



# **Program Highlights: Coordinated Entry**

### • Mission Access Point:

• Dolores Street Community Services will open an adult Access Point in the Mission this month.

• Equity Plan for Casa Esperanza (at 3061 16th Street) placements:

• Dolores Street and Larkin will present on equity plan for this program at the July 14 CE LHCB Subcommittee Meeting.

### •Safe Housing Working Group:

• Community survey concluded with 100 responses.



## **Program Highlights: Shelter Openings**

#### **•** Dolores Shelter Program:

- Opened on June 6 with capacity for 21 guests.
- Additional two dorms will open in July (including Jazzie's Place) for full capacity of 53 guests.

#### **•** Baldwin SAFE Navigation Center:

- Non-congregate shelter operated by Five Keys and Providence with 160 units.
- Meals, case management, group activities, health, and roving DPH behavioral healthcare.
- Opening on July 18, 2022.

#### ∽711 Post Semi-Congregate Shelter:

- 24/7 shelter operated by Urban Alchemy for up to 250 adults in 123 rooms.
- Services: meals, care coordination, health support.
- Opening on July 18, 2022.



### **Program Highlights: Shelter**

•Street Ambassador Services launched through Five Keys:

- Promote acceptance of HSH-funded sites in two corridors.
- **SOMA** (near future 1064 Mission PSH): started June 15.
- Lower Nob Hill (711 Post shelter): starting July 11.

Bayview Hunters Point Foundation started case management and supportive services at the Bayview Vehicle Triage Center on July 1.



## **Program Highlights: Housing**

### Program Openings:

- 835 Turk: move-ins started in June.
- **Bayview FHSP:** launching in August 2022.

### Procurement Updates:

- TAY/Family FHSP & Family Housing Ladder: SOI closed on July 5.
- **City Gardens:** SOI will close on July 22.

### In-Home Support Services (IHSS):

- Expanded from pilot to several dozen PSH sites in June.
- Help with housekeeping, laundry, grocery shopping, and other tasks.
- •Other Key Updates:
  - Online Critical Incident Reporting form launched.
  - Overdose prevention policy rollout in process.





# Budget Highlights

### FY2022-24 Budget Timeline

June 1: Mayor's Proposed Budget released.

June: HSH budget agreement reached. July/August:

Board of Supervisors adopts FY22-24 budget and sends to Mayor for signature.



### **Proposed Investments in PSH Equity**

• \$67.4 million over two years in HSH's existing PSH portfolio.

#### Wage Equity Investments: **\$30 million**

\$3 m annually: \$28/hour wage floor for case managers

\$12 m annually: frontline property management staff. Case Management: \$32.4 million

\$16.2 m annually: increase case

management staffing

Achieves 1:20 ratio for family & youth; moves closer to 1:25 for adults.

#### Capital Improvements: \$5 million

One-time funding for repairs and improvements.

Wi-Fi and other upgrades.



# Proposed Investments: End Transgender Homelessness

- 150 scattered-site permanent housing subsidies to be allocated for Transgender and Gender Non-Conforming (TGNC) households.
- Acquire and operate **50 to 80 units** of PSH for **TGNC youth**.
- \$6 million over two years (\$3 million annually):
  - Build capacity among TGNC-serving providers.
  - Fund short-term/shallow subsidies and/or provide flexible financial assistance.



### **New Proposed Shelter Investments**

- New cabin program in the Mission:
  - **\$2 million enhancement** in FY2022-23.
  - Leverages another **\$5 million** to build new non-congregate cabin site for up to 70 guests.
- Operate new semi- and noncongregate shelter programs:
  - **\$25 m** in anticipated new state funding over two years.
  - Operate ~410 beds of non- & semicongregate shelter at 711 Post & Baldwin Hotel.




## **Continuing Key Shelter Investments**

Program	Details	Investment Level
Vehicle Triage Centers	<ul> <li>Continue Bayview VTC.</li> <li>Capital and operating funds for a second VTC intended to serve west side of the City.</li> </ul>	• \$15 million over two years
Safe Sleep & Cabins	<ul> <li>Maintains cabin program at 33 Gough and ~55 tent spaces of Safe Sleep in the Mission and Bayview in FY2022-23.</li> <li>Continue Safe Sleep and cabin programs in FY2023-24 with prior year appropriations.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>FY2022-23: \$4 million for 33 Gough &amp; \$4.1 million for Safe Sleep sites.</li> </ul>
Non-Congregate Shelter	<ul> <li>Extend one year of operations at three hotel- based emergency shelters providing ~300 units.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>\$24 million in state and federal grants funds previously appropriated for SIP operations.</li> </ul>
